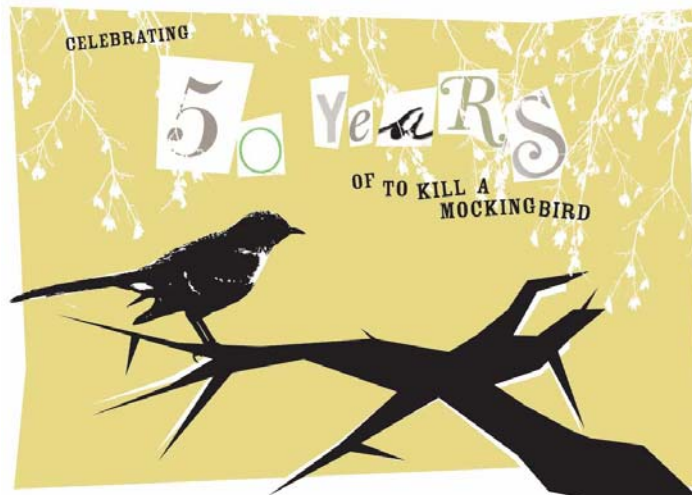


## 50th Anniversary of *To Kill a Mockingbird*

On April 7, Mr. Lee Thuston '74 will be the last of the *Called to the Bar* speakers for this academic year. Mr. Thuston is the Managing Partner for the firm of Burr & Forman. He served as Alabama Counsel during the site selection and negotiation processes for several major companies as they chose to locate their facilities in the state of Alabama. Those companies include Mercedes-Benz, The Boeing Company, Mi-Tech Steel, Inc. and IPSCO Steel. He also assisted Honda Manufacturing of Alabama with the process leading up to the development of its plant in Lincoln, Alabama.

Mrs. Kauffman graduated Georgetown University Law Center and is licensed to practice law in D.C., Virginia, and Alabama. She currently devotes her practice to advising the University and Health System on legal issues related to the UAB Health System operating entities, including a large teaching hospital and affiliated clinics and community hospitals. Prior to joining UAB's counsel, she worked in a private firm that practiced exclusively in health law. While at the firm, she specialized in federal healthcare regulation, including Medicare/Medicaid anti-fraud and abuse rules, physician self-referral legislation, and Medicare reimbursement; assisting clients in corporate transactions, managed care networks, and federal litigation.

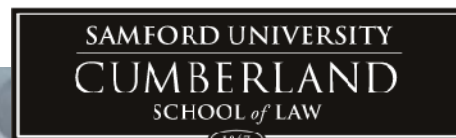
## 2010 Spirit of Service Awards

The recognition comes in the form of the *Spirit of Service Award* [a certificate suitable for framing] and an Ice Cream Social appreciation event. The certificates will be presented to awardees on **Wednesday, April 21, 2010** at 1:00 PM on the East Patio.

You are encouraged to apply for the award. Examples of qualifying work would include: Street Law, VITA, Teen Court, Legal Services, work done through Law School organizations like the Community Services Organization, Women in Law, BLSA, and the Christian Legal Society, as well as work done through a favorite charitable organization or your church. All 30 hours do not need to have been completed through the same organization.
